## MAY AGRICULTURAL PRICES HIGHLIGHTS

The index of prices paid by farmers for commodities and services, interest, taxes, and wage rates in May 2000 was unchanged at 119. Compared with May 1999, the index was up 4 points (3.5 percent). The index of prices received by farmers for dairy products advanced 1 point during the month of May 2000 to 92. Compared with May 1999, the index was down 5 points (5.2 percent).

Prices received by farmers in May with changes from April were: for All Milk, \$12.00 per hundredweight (cwt.), up 10-cents; Fluid Grade Milk, \$12.00 per cwt., unchanged; and for Manufacturing Grade Milk, \$10.20 per cwt., unchanged.

## USDA ANNOUNCES AMENDMENTS TO FLUID MILK PROMOTION ORDER

The U.S Department of Agriculture announced June 5, 2000, that it is amending the Fluid Milk Promotion Order effective June 7, 2000.

Kathleen A. Merrigan, administrator of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, said the amendments allow fluid milk processors to have up to three members instead of two on the board. The amendments also allow board members whose fluid milk processor company affiliation has changed to serve for six months or until a successor is appointed, whichever is sooner. The amendments ensure board continuity and full board representation, she said.

The National Fluid Milk Processor Promotion Board, which administers the Fluid Milk Order, requested the proposed changes. The program is financed by a mandatory 20-cent per hundredweight assessment on all fluid milk products processed and marketed in consumer-type packages by fluid milk processors in the 48 contiguous states and the District of Columbia. Fluid milk processors who process and market more than 500,000 pounds of fluid milk products are charged the assessment, and those who process and market 500,000 pounds or less are exempted from the order.

AMS encourages all eligible women, minorities and persons with disabilities to serve and participate in its committee and board activities. It is USDA's policy that membership on industry-governed committees and boards accurately reflect the diversity of individuals served by the programs.
