Dairy Forecasts for 2023

With the continued erosion of dairy margins and the average milk cow inventory reported through July, projections for the milking herd in 2023 are lowered by 5,000 head to 9.405 million. The milk-per-cow forecast for the year is lowered by 40 pounds to 24,185 as the hot and humid weather impacted the milk yield in July, likely further impacting the August production, and may have residual effects on cow lactation for the remainder of the year. Total milk production is now forecast at 227.5 billion pounds, 0.4 billion lower than the previous forecast.

On a milk-fat basis, imports for 2023 are forecast at 7.4 billion pounds, 0.1 billion pounds lower than last month due to recent weakness in imports of cheese, butter, and whole milk powder, which will likely continue through the remainder of the year. Relative to last month's forecasts, total exports and ending stocks held steady at 11.1 billion and 14.6 billion pounds, respectively. Domestic use is forecast at 222.6 billion pounds, 0.5 billion lower than the previous projection but 3.5 billion pounds higher than 2022 domestic use. Higher expected prices for cheese and butter will likely contribute to constrained domestic use.

On a skim-solids basis, the forecast for 2023 imports is 6.5 billion pounds, unchanged from the previous forecast. The forecast for exports is lowered by 0.5 billion pounds to 50.0 billion pounds due to soft demand for whey products from China and other Asian markets. At 182.6 billion pounds, the forecast for 2023 domestic use is unchanged from last month.

The 2023 wholesale price forecasts for Cheddar cheese and dry whey are revised up to 1.810 (+3.5 cents), and 0.345 (+2.0 cents) per pound, due to recent price developments as well as steady domestic demand support. With higher projected prices, the Class III milk price forecast for 2023 is 17.35 per cwt, 0.45 higher than last month.

The 2023 wholesale price forecast for butter is revised up 4.5 cents to \$2.540 per pound on strong domestic demand, while the NDM price projection is revised down 1.5 cents to \$1.160 per pound due to weaker expected demand. With the higher butter price projection more than offsetting the lower NDM projected price, the price forecast for Class IV milk is revised up \$0.10 to \$18.60 per cwt. The all-milk price forecast for 2023 is adjusted up by \$0.45 to \$20.40 per cwt.

Dairy Forecasts for 2024

The milk supply typically responds to changes in prices with a lag of several months. The low margins experienced in 2023 are expected to contribute to further contraction of the dairy herd in the first half of 2024. However, some rebuilding of the milking herd is expected in late 2024 as milk prices improve and feed costs moderate. The milking cow herd forecast for 2024 rounds to 9.385 million head, unchanged from the last forecast but 20 million head lower than the 2023 forecast. The milk per cow forecast for 2024 is unchanged from last month at 24,560 pounds. Milk production for 2024 is forecast at 230.4 billion pounds, 0.1 billion lower than the previous forecast. Year-over-year, total milk production is expected to increase, driven by higher projected yields.

On a milk-fat basis for 2024, the forecast for imports is decreased 0.1 billion pounds to 7.4 billion pounds due to lowerexpected imports of cheese and butter. The forecast for total exports is decreased by 0.3 billion pounds to 12.1 billion pounds based on expectations of lower exports of butter and cheese. Domestic use is now forecast at 224.7 billion pounds, 0.1 billion higher than the previous projection.

On a skim-solids basis for 2024, the forecast for imports is unchanged at 6.8 billion pounds. The forecast for total exports is decreased by 0.3 billion pounds to 53.0 billion pounds due to lower expected exports of whey products and cheese.

ORDER 33 MARKET SUMMARY

The Producer Price Differential for the Mideast Marketing Area for September 2023 was \$0.99, and the Statistical Uniform Price was \$19.38 for the month. The Statistical Uniform Price is \$1.31 higher than last month and is \$3.26 lower than September 2022.

The Producer Butterfat Price of \$3.1264 per pound increased \$0.1046 from August and is down \$0.4389 from a year ago. The Protein Price of \$2.3027 is up \$0.2176 from last month and is up \$0.4180 from September 2022. The Other Solids Price in September was \$0.0992 per pound, an increase from last month's price of \$0.0648 and \$0.2006 lower than last September. The Somatic Cell Adjustment rate for

September was \$0.00097 per cwt. September producer receipts of 1.53 billion pounds were 9.7 percent higher than August and 17.4 percent higher than September 2022 production of 1.30 billion pounds. Producer milk allocated to Class I accounted for 35.9 percent of the total producer milk in September 2022, lower than the 38.3 percent in August, and lower than the 39.1 percent in September 2022. A total of 3,439 producers were pooled on the Mideast Order compared to 3,449 producers pooled in September 2022.

The market average content of producer milk was as follows: Butterfat 4.01%; Protein 3.18%; Other Solids 5.78% and Nonfat Solids 8.96%.

Ending stocks are projected at 12.00 billion pounds, 0.1 billion lower than the previous projection. The domestic use is now forecast at 183.3 billion pounds, 0.4 billion pounds higher than the previous projection.

The 2024 price forecasts for Cheddar cheese, butter, and dry whey are increased to \$1.845 (+9.0 cents), \$2.550 (+12.0 cents), and \$0.315 (+1.0 cents) per pound, respectively. The 2024 NDM price projection is lowered to \$1.090 (-3.5 cents). The Class III milk price forecast for 2024 is adjusted to \$17.55 per cwt, up \$1.00 from last month's forecast, while the Class IV milk price forecast is \$18.00 per cwt, up \$0.20. The all-milk price forecast for 2024 is \$20.30 per cwt, \$0.95 higher than last month's forecast.

August Milk Production Down 0.3 Percent

Milk production in the 24 major States during August totaled 18.2 billion pounds, down 0.3 percent from August 2022. July revised production, at 18.2 billion pounds, was down 0.8 percent from July 2022. The July revision represented a decrease of 27 million pounds or 0.1 percent from last month's preliminary production estimate.

Production per cow in the United States averaged 2,038 pounds for August, 2 pounds below August 2022.

The number of milk cows on farms in the United States was 8.91 million head, 15,000 head less than August 2022, but 1,000 head more than July 2023.

The Mideast Marketing Area has four states represented in the 24 major states used above. They are Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. Milk production in these Mideast states during August totaled 2.7 billion pounds, up 65 million pounds or 2.5 percent from August 2022.

Production per cow in the Mideast states averaged 1,993 pounds for August. This was an increase of 15 pounds from August 2022.

The number of milk cows was 1.35 million head, 18,000 head more than August 2022.

August 2023 Highlights


Total cheese output (excluding cottage cheese) was 1.15 billion pounds, 0.2 percent below August 2022 and 0.1 percent below July 2023. Italian type cheese production totaled 484 million pounds, 0.6 percent below August 2022 and 0.2 percent above July 2023. American type cheese production totaled 459 million pounds, 0.3 percent above August 2022 and 2.0 percent below July 2023.

Butter production was 140 million pounds, 2.1 percent below August 2022 and 12.1 percent below July 2023.

Dry milk products (comparisons in percentage with August 2022) Nonfat dry milk, human - 113 million pounds, down 15.2 percent. Skim milk powder - 57.2 million pounds, down 12.7 percent.

Frozen products (comparisons in percentage with August 2022) Ice cream, regular (hard) - 66.2 million gallons, up 1.1 percent. Ice cream, lowfat (total) - 40.5 million gallons, down 5.2 percent. Sherbet (hard) - 2.15 million gallons, up 7.1 percent. Frozen yogurt (total) - 4.21 million gallons, up 6.9 percent.




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
PRODUCER MILK CLASSIFICATION



<u>Producer Receipts:</u> Producer receipts for the Mideast Order totaled 1.50 billion pounds in October 2023. The pounds allocated to Class I represented 39.6 percent of the total pounds. Producer receipts decreased 30.5 million pounds compared to September 2023, and were up 173.6 million pounds from the prior year.

STATISTICAL UNIFORM PRICE






Statistical Uniform Price: The Mideast Federal Order Statistical Uniform Price (SUP) at Cuyahoga County, OH was \$19.66 per cwt for October 2023. The October 2023 SUP was \$3.33per cwt lower than the October 2022 SUP. The October 2023 SUP is \$0.28 per cwt higher than the September 2023 SUP.

October 2023 Statistical Uniform Price: Using the Class III Price formula at 3.5% BF, the component values for the October 2023 SUP are: \$3.13 per cut for protein \$13.00 per cut

October 2023 SUP are: \$3.13 per cwt for protein, \$13.00 per cwt for butterfat and \$0.71 per cwt for other solids. Also included in the SUP is the \$2.82 per cwt producer price differential. (May not add to total due to rounding.)
